**First Reading: Is 65:17-25**

For I am about to create new heavens  
and a new earth;  
the former things shall not be remembered  
or come to mind.  
But be glad and rejoice forever  
in what I am creating;  
for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy,  
and its people as a delight.  
I will rejoice in Jerusalem,  
and delight in my people;  
no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it,  
or the cry of distress.  
No more shall there be in it  
an infant that lives but a few days,  
or an old person who does not live out a lifetime;  
for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth,  
and one who falls short of a hundred will be considered accursed.  
They shall build houses and inhabit them;  
they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit.  
They shall not build and another inhabit;  
they shall not plant and another eat;  
for like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be,  
and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of their hands.  
They shall not labor in vain,  
or bear children for calamity;  
for they shall be offspring blessed by the LORD—  
and their descendants as well.  
Before they call I will answer,  
while they are yet speaking I will hear.  
The wolf and the lamb shall feed together,  
the lion shall eat straw like the ox;  
but the serpent—its food shall be dust!  
They shall not hurt or destroy  
on all my holy mountain,  
says the LORD.

**Second Reading: 1 Cor 15:19-26**

If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

**Psalm 118:1-2, 14-24**

*1* Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his mercy endures for ever.

**2 Let Israel now proclaim, \***

**”His mercy endures for ever.”**

*14* The Lord is my strength and my song, \*  
and he has become my salvation.

**15 There is a sound of exultation and victory \*  
in the tents of the righteous:**

*16* ”The right hand of the Lord has triumphed! \*  
the right hand of the Lord is exalted!  
the right hand of the Lord has triumphed!”

**17 I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of  
the Lord.**

*18* The Lord has punished me sorely, \*  
but he did not hand me over to death.

**19 Open for me the gates of righteousness; \***

**I will enter them; I will offer thanks to the Lord.**

*20* ”This is the gate of the Lord; he who is righteous may enter.”

**21 I will give thanks to you, for you answered me \*  
and have become my salvation.**

*22* The same stone which the builders rejected \*  
has become the chief cornerstone.

**23 This is the Lord’s doing, and it is marvellous in our  
eyes.**

*24* On this day the Lord has acted; we will rejoice and be glad in it.

Holy and mighty God, your Son’s triumph over sin and death has opened to us the gate of eternal life. Purify our hearts that we may follow where he has gone and share in the radiance of his glory. We ask this for the sake of our risen Lord.
