**First Reading: Jer 8:18-9:1**

My joy is gone, grief is upon me,  
my heart is sick.

Hark, the cry of my poor people  
from far and wide in the land:

“Is the LORD not in Zion?

Is her King not in her?”

(“Why have they provoked me to anger with their images,  
with their foreign idols?”)

“The harvest is past, the summer is ended,  
and we are not saved.”

For the hurt of my poor people I am hurt,  
I mourn, and dismay has taken hold of me.

Is there no balm in Gilead?

Is there no physician there?

Why then has the health of my poor people  
not been restored?

O that my head were a spring of water,  
and my eyes a fountain of tears,

so that I might weep day and night  
for the slain of my poor people!

**Second Reading: 1 Tim 2:1-7**

First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions,  
and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all who are  
in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in  
all godliness and dignity. This is right and is acceptable in the sight  
of God our Savior, who desires everyone to be saved and to come  
to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God;

there is also one mediator between God and humankind,  
Christ Jesus, himself human,

who gave himself a ransom for all  
—this was attested at the right time. For this I was appointed a  
herald and an apostle (I am telling the truth, I am not lying), a  
teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth.

**Psalm 79:1-9**

1 O God, the heathen have come into your inheritance;  
they have profaned your holy temple; \*  
they have made Jerusalem a heap of rubble.

**2 They have given the bodies of your servants as food for  
the birds of the air, \*  
and the flesh of your faithful ones to the beasts  
of the field.**

3 They have shed their blood like water on every side  
of Jerusalem, \*

and there was no one to bury them.

**4 We have become a reproach to our neighbours, \*  
an object of scorn and derision to those around us.**

5 How long will you be angry, O Lord? \*  
will your fury blaze like fire for ever?

**6 Pour out your wrath upon the heathen who have not  
known you \*  
and upon the kingdoms that have not called upon  
your name.**

7 For they have devoured Jacob \*  
and made his dwelling a ruin.

**8 Remember not our past sins;  
let your compassion be swift to meet us; \*  
for we have been brought very low.**

9 Help us, O God our Saviour, for the glory of your name; \*  
deliver us and forgive us our sins, for your name’s sake.

Gracious God, in times of sorrow and depression, when hope  
itself seems lost, help us to remember the transforming power  
of your steadfast love and to give thanks for that new life we  
cannot now imagine. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ
