FROM THE DESK OF REV. NITA- It is four weeks from today that the season of Advent begins. A time of preparation, anticipation and of the wait for the arrival of Christ’s birth. Traditionally in our Anglican Communion Advent can and should include time for reflection and contemplation. The lead up time to Christmas day becomes so busy with events and our “to do lists” we often miss out on the blessing of taking time to slow down, to reflect, and to meditate. I am proposing a one day Advent retreat with a tentative date of Dec. 3, the time and place yet to be announced. Please share with me your thoughts and ideas about this proposed event.

First Reading: Hab 1:1-4; 2:1-4

The oracle that the prophet Habakkuk saw.

O LORD, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen? Or cry to you “Violence!” and you will not save? Why do you make me see wrongdoing and look at trouble? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise. So the law becomes slack and justice never prevails. The wicked surround the righteous – therefore judgment comes forth perverted. I will stand at my watchpost, and station myself on the rampart; I will keep watch to see what he will say to me, and what he will answer concerning my complaint. Then the LORD answered me and said: Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so that a runner may read it. For there is still a vision for the appointed time; it speaks of the end, and does not lie. If it seems to tarry, wait for it; it will surely come, it will not delay. Look at the proud! Their spirit is not right in them, but the righteous live by their faith.

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy,

To the church of the Thessalonians in God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
