St. Paul's Church was built between 1842 and 1844 to serve the community of Marshalltown. Rev. William Bullock was the Rector at the time of consecration in 1844. The Church served the community of Marshalltown for 162 years. Many of the early residents of Marshalltown were buried on the grounds surrounding the Church.

St. Paul's Church was closed and deconsecrated at a service conducted by Bishop Fred Hiltz on November 19, 2006. The building, having become unsafe, was demolished in 2013. The dedicated stained glass windows and many of the wooden furnishings were preserved and are in storage. The church bell was also preserved, and over the ensuing year, a small committee met to design and commission a memorial, incorporating the bell and a brief history of St. Paul's.
